Peace Boat Visits: Played Historic Role in Nuclear Test Ban

Veterans For Peace recovered and restored the original peace boat, the *Golden Rule*, that set sail in 1958 to stop nuclear testing in the atmosphere, and which inspired many peace makers and peace ships that followed. The restored *Golden Rule* is voyaging once more, to show that a nuclear peace is possible, and that bravery and tenacity can overcome militarism. In 1958, four Quaker peace activists sailed the Golden Rule toward the Marshall Islands to try to stop thermonuclear weapons testing. Sailing from California to Hawaii on their way to the test site, their crew was arrested by the US Coast Guard. Despite the arrest, the Golden Rule started a world-wide movement against nuclear weapons which eventually lead to the Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty of 1963. The boat will dock at Canalside and visitors are welcome on deck on **Monday, July 31**st and **Tuesday, August 1**st. Events are being organized by the WNY Peace Center.

DEC Launches New York Harmful Algal Blooms Notification and Reporting System

DEC and the NYS Department of Health have started the 2023 online New York Harmful Algal Bloom System (NYHABS) interactive map. DEC is asking the public and trained algal bloom samplers to send reports of HABs with photos electronically via a simple, mobile phone-friendly form. Once evaluated by DEC and DOH, reports are posted to the NYHABS page providing easy access to inform the public about HAB locations in New York. Most algae blooms are harmless. However, exposure to toxins and other substances from certain HABs can make people and animals sick. HABs have been monitored closely across New York State since 2012. DEC's Division of Water recently published an analysis of HABs titled: "Detections of cyanobacteria harmful algal blooms (cyanoHABs) in New York State, United States (2012–2020)."

Environmental Working Group Provides List of Verified Sunscreens

While sunscreens protect us from damaging UV rays, they can also expose us to harmful chemicals. Oxybenzone, a hormone-disrupting sunscreen chemical which has been shown to absorb through the skin, has declined in usage due to consumer demand. Legislation to Allow Electronic Repairs.

The <u>Digital Fair Repair Act</u> is a new law that should make it easier for consumers to repair certain electronic devices, including laptops and smartphones, thereby saving money and reducing harmful e-waste. The law compels manufacturers doing business in the state to make repair parts, tools, and documentation, including schematics, available to the public, something companies had not been required to do in the past. It went into effect on July 1, 2023. This should increase the availability of electronic device repair and bring down prices. Until now, independent repair businesses haven't always had the tools and information they needed to fix broken devices, forcing consumers to go back to the manufacturers for repairs or to just buy replacements. The new law is meant to increase competition for repair work—and let consumers fix their own gadgets if they feel technically capable. The law covers electronic devices purchased at retail, including devices popular with consumers like laptops, smartphones, and tablets. It does not apply to so-called white goods, an industry term that typically refers to big appliances like refrigerators and washing machines.

'Clean. Drain. Dry.' Your Watercraft to Protect Waters from Aquatic Invasive Species

DEC reminds boaters to clean, drain, and dry their boats and trailers and disinfect their fishing gear before recreating in New York's waters to prevent the spread of harmful aquatic invasive species (AIS). Watercraft inspection stewards (boat stewards) are deploying across the state to educate and assist the public in cleaning equipment this season to prevent the introduction and spread of non-native plants and animals in New York waterbodies. A New Exotic Pest in NY: The Elm Zigzag Sawfly

The elm zigzag sawfly (*Aproceros leucopoda*) is an insect that only eats elm leaves and can cause severe defoliation (leaf loss) that threatens tree health. They get their name from the easily recognizable "zigzag" feeding pattern larvae create as they chew through leaves. However, when most of the tree's leaves have been eaten, the zigzag pattern may not always be as clear because larvae will eat all the leaf tissue down to the vein. DEC and Partners Team Up to Knock Out Invasive Species

In early June, DEC partnered with staff from the Western New York Partnership for Regional Invasive Species

Management (WNY PRISM) to control invasive shrubs as part of a reforestation project on Tonawanda Wildlife Management

Area in Genesee and Niagara Counties. Invasive shrubs were treated with herbicide throughout 15-acres of old fields to reduce competition with native trees and shrubs. These small fields have been mowed for decades to keep them open but now we plan to return them to forest to reduce habitat fragmentation and increase young forest. An abundance of desirable native trees and shrubs are already establishing naturally in many areas and several hundred seedlings were also planted this spring. This was part of the WNY PRISM's Crew Assistance Program that works with partners on invasive species management projects.

Make Cigarette Butts Part of Your Cleanups

Littered cigarette butts: besides ugly to look at, they are hazardous to our kids, pets, wildlife and gardens. When left in the environment, littered cigarette butts <u>leach toxic chemicals</u>, such as arsenic (used to kill rats) and lead, that may be carried as runoff to drains and end up polluting our rivers and lakes right here in Western New York. Because cigarette butts are primarily made of plastic filters that don't biodegrade, the butts that aren't eaten by wildlife simply pile up on shorelines or at the bottom of bodies of water. Turmeric Compound May Reduce Coral Bleaching

Italian researchers <u>have recently published a study</u> in *ACS Applied Materials and Interfaces*, which demonstrates the efficacy of curcumin, a natural antioxidant substance extracted from turmeric, in reducing coral bleaching, a phenomenon caused primarily by climate change. The research group apply a biomaterial based on zein, a protein derived from maize, to deliver the molecule without causing damage to the surrounding marine environment. Tests conducted at the Genoa Aquarium have shown significant efficacy in preventing coral bleaching.

New York Great Lakes Shore Viewer

DEC's <u>Great Lakes Program</u> has launched the <u>New York Great Lakes Shore Viewer</u>, an interactive map that allows users to explore approximately 850 miles of New York's Great Lakes shorelines, including Lake Erie, the Niagara River, Lake Ontario, the St. Lawrence River, and many of the larger embayments. The viewer includes coastal oblique aerial imagery of the NY Great Lakes shorelines collected annually by citizen volunteers with the Civil Air Patrol – NY Wing in partnership with the DEC. Routinely updated and publicly accessible coastal oblique imagery is intended to support state resilience programs, promote ecosystem-based shoreline management, and assist with shoreline change monitoring.

EV Charging Funding Assistance

Charge Ready NY 2.0 (PON 5367) is an incentive program that provides \$4,000 per charging port installed at a public facility within a DAC and \$2,000 per charging port installed at a workplace or MUD location upon completion of the installation of charging equipment and the provision of appropriate documentation. An additional incentive of \$500 per port may be awarded for eligible Level 2 charging equipment installed at a workplace or MUD location within a DAC. Equipment Owners at workplace or MUD locations may choose to participate in a bonus program to receive additional incentives. Public and private (for-profit and not-for-profit) entities may participate in the Program. Applicants can be the Equipment Owners or the Installers on behalf of the Equipment Owners. Updated Great Lakes Action Agenda

DEC has released an updated New York's Great Lakes Action Agenda (GLAA) 2023, a strategic, ecosystem-based action plan to guide restoration and conservation and foster sustainable, resilient communities in New York's Great Lakes region. The GLAA advances efforts to safeguard water quality, improve habitats for fish and wildlife, manage invasive species, promote sustainability, and enhance community resilience to climate change. The region spans more than 40 percent of New York State's land area and includes Lake Erie, the Niagara River, Lake Ontario, the St. Lawrence River, and contributing watersheds. The release of the updated GLAA coincides with the development of the fourth federal action plan for the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative (GLRI), which will guide federal restoration and protection investments in the region through 2029. Since 2010, nearly \$270 million in GLRI funding has been secured for Great Lakes projects in New York State. View the updated GLAA on DEC's website.

Managing New York Forests for Birds

The Audubon Society has a free, <u>downloadable guide</u> for landowners to provide guidance in improving habitat for birds. The guide identifies priority habitat and the importance of limiting habitat fragmentation for maintaining bird species. Share the guide with anyone that has forested land.

Grants for Youth Field Trips

Did you know there is a grant to take youth on field trips? The Connect-Kids-to-Parks Field Trip Grant Program (Connect Kids) is designed to connect students in New York State with nature and history. Each grant provides reimbursement of up to \$40 per student (and \$80 for Special Education students) for field trips to state and federal parks, education and nature centers, forests, historic sites, fish hatcheries and other outdoor recreation areas. Help Prevent Wasted Food

EPA's Preventing Wasted Food in Your Community: A Social Marketing Toolkit is now available! The toolkit is a resource for states, territories, local governments, Tribes, and nongovernmental organizations who want to start behavior change campaigns to help prevent food waste in their communities. The toolkit includes a planning process that uses social marketing principles to ensure communities are tailoring the campaigns to their communities' needs. The toolkit is accompanied by food waste prevention campaign materials created by municipalities and organizations that are available for use and customization by any community.

Reducing Nitrogen Runoff Using Smart Farming System

A new farming system developed by researchers aims to solve one of the biggest problems in modern agriculture: the overuse of fertilizers to improve crop yields and the resulting chemical runoff that pollutes the world's air and water. The <u>study</u> shows that a copper-based hydrogel can capture excess nitrate waste and transform it to ammonia to be reused. In tests, the system had the ability to match or increase crop yields over traditional methods while also minimizing environmental impacts. The smart farming system (SSFS) produced wheat and rice plants that grew taller with bigger leaves, compared with other methods, with less nitrogen runoff.

Regenerate NY: \$850,000 in Grants Now Available for Eligible Private Forest Landowners

The 'Regenerate NY' Forestry Cost Share Grant Program is designed to assist private landowners in growing the next generation of forests, which are crucial for mitigating climate change, providing wildlife habitat, protecting air and water quality, and supplying an important renewable resource. Private landowners planning to restore or establish five or more acres of forest land in New York State, may apply for grant awards ranging from a minimum of \$10,000 to a maximum of \$100,000, with a required 25 percent match. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, planting trees, soil scarification, removing competing vegetation that would interfere with seedling establishment and growth, and installation of deer fence. Applicants must work with a forester or a qualified natural resource professional to develop their project. Applications can be <u>submitted</u> through the NYS Grants Gateway and will be accepted until 5 p.m. on Oct. 6, 2023, or until funds are depleted, whichever comes first. Grants will be awarded on a rolling basis. Applicants need to establish an account in the Grants Gateway System. Once registered, applicants can search the Grants Gateway for "Regenerate NY."

Swallow-wort Biocontrol Release!

WNY PRISM is excited to announce that in early June alongside our partners, NYISRI, CCE-Erie County, Genesee County Park and Forest and Town of Clarence, we released 80 *Hypena opulenta* pupae, the swallow-wort biocontrol agent, at two sites in western New York. *Hypena opulenta* is a moth that feeds exclusively on the leaves of black and pale swallow-wort. After more than 10 years of research to verify safety to ecosystems, the moth was approved for field release by the USDA in 2017. Read more about swallow-wort biocontrol research here.

Help Track Spotted Lanternfly

Spotted lanternfly (SLF) is an invasive pest that feeds on a variety of plants including grapes, hops and maple trees, posing a severe threat to New York State's forests and agriculture. SLF was first found in PA in 2014, and several populations have since been found in NY, including Buffalo as of September 2022. SLF's preferred host plant, tree-of-heaven (TOH), is already found in New York State. Help survey for SLF and TOH by picking a location, surveying it 2-3 times throughout 2023 and reporting your observations. WAVE Volunteers Needed

Water Assessments by Volunteer Evaluators (WAVE) is a participatory citizen-based water quality assessment program developed by DEC. The purpose of WAVE is to enable citizen scientists to collect biological data for evaluation of water quality on wadeable streams in New York State. Online Tool to View Earth's Changes

Google Earth Engine's new tool, <u>Dynamic World</u> was built in collaboration with the nonprofit <u>World Resources Institute</u>. Dynamic World pulls from satellite data to create detailed maps in near real-time. It gives users the ability to zoom in on the planet in 10-by-10 meter squares from satellite images collected every two to five days. Artificial intelligence is used to categorize each pixel into nine classes that range from bare ground to trees, crops, and buildings. The tool allows users to explore and track and monitor changes in these terrestrial ecosystems over time.

Wood: Good or Bad for Emissions

While wood is a renewable resource, living trees are important for sequestering carbon and improving air quality. So what's with this paper just published in Nature by environmental non-profit World Resources Institute (WRI), stating that wood consumption accounts for about 10% of the world's annual greenhouse gas emissions? That's more than all the planet's passenger cars combined. And the world is on track to harvest 50% more wood by 2050. Could this shake our faith in wood's role as a climate hero? EPA Invites Youth to Serve on National Environmental Youth Advisory Council

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has established its first-ever National Environmental Youth Advisory Council (NEYAC). The NEYAC will provide independent advice and recommendations to Administrator Michael S. Regan on how to increase EPA's efforts to address a range of environmental issues as they relate to youth communities. The NEYAC will provide a critical perspective on how the impacts of climate change and other environmental harms affect youth communities. EPA seeks applications for youth to fill 16 vacancies on the NEYAC. Selected applicants will contribute to a balance of perspectives, backgrounds, and experience of the council and will be appointed by the Administrator. All NEYAC members will be between the ages of 16 and 29. As part of the agency's commitment to centering environmental justice communities, at least 50% of the overall membership of NEYAC will come from, reside primarily in, and/or do most of their work in disadvantaged communities. **Applications are due by August 22**. EPA will host a virtual application webinar during which the public can ask EPA staff questions live. The program will fund the replacement of existing school buses with clean and zero-emission school buses. Deadline: **August 22**.

<u>Small Business Innovation Grant</u>- to support the development and commercialization of innovative environmental technologies. Deadline: **August 23**.
