Landscape Maintenance Technician Training Program

The Landscape Maintenance Technician program is designed to offer classroom instruction, in-field training, and a paid internship program serving BOPC's urban park system that consists of 850 acres of beautifully designed parks, parkways and Circles. The 120-hour course will include instruction offered at BCAT beginning **January 12**, followed by in-field training and a paid internship. Public Meeting on Polystyrene Foam Packaging Ban

The NYS Department of Environmental Conservation in partnership with the New York State Pollution Prevention Institute (NYSP2I) invites stakeholders to attend a one hour virtual public meeting on **Thursday, January 21, 2021 at 11 a.m.** to learn about the Expanded Polystyrene Foam Container and Polystyrene Loose Fill Packaging Ban. Beginning January 1, 2022, no covered food service provider or store (retail or wholesale) will be allowed to sell, offer for sale, or distribute disposable food service containers that contain expanded polystyrene foam in New York. In addition, no manufacturer or store will be allowed to sell, offer for sale, or distribute polystyrene loose fill packaging (commonly referred to as packing peanuts) in the state. <u>Registration</u> is required to attend the virtual meeting. Help Prevent Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease from Harming New York's Rabbits and Hares

Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) is a fatal virus that affects rabbits and hares. A new strain, RHDV2, identified in 2010 has recently jumped to wild rabbits and hares in the southwestern U.S., where it spread to six states within four months. The virus can infect wild rabbits and hares, in addition to domestic rabbits. RHDV2 is extremely hardy, easily transmitted, and highly lethal to rabbits and hares. It does not infect humans or other animals like dogs or cats. RHDV2 spreads easily through direct contact between rabbits or contact with contaminated environments or objects. The most likely potential routes of introduction to New York are through transported domestic rabbits, internationally imported rabbit products, or people who travel to outbreak areas in the southwest. NYSERDA Green Jobs Green New York Energy Studies

Small businesses and not-for-profit organizations can now receive an energy study **AT NO COST** to help them identify opportunities to make their buildings more energy efficient. The energy study is a valuable tool to understand how to reduce energy usage and costs in your facility, and it provides a "road map" to plan for improvements that can be made as budgets permit. *NYSERDA is waiving the fee for a limited time*. Small businesses with 100 or fewer Full-Time Equivalent Employees (FTEs) company-wide or not-for-profit organizations of any size are eligible for the program. The energy study includes: A comprehensive walk through of the facility; site staff interviews; utility bill analysis; fuel-neutral, unbiased evaluation of potential low-cost/no-cost and capital improvement energy efficiency upgrades; and a report that outlines potential energy and cost savings opportunities for your facility. Once the study is complete, you receive assistance in identifying potential utility incentives and low-cost financing options to help take the next steps toward implementing energy saving projects. Note: A small business or not-for-profit who had a prior NYSERDA energy study is eligible for the program if their study was performed at least three years ago. Online Course on Organic Farming Offered

<u>Basics of Organic Farming</u> is a self-directed online course for beginning orchard and vegetable-crop farmers, existing organic farmers, and farmers in transition to organic production. This course is a joint effort of the Organic Farming Research Foundation (OFRF) and others. It consists of six modules: 1) soil health; 2) weed management; 3) irrigation and water management; 4) insect pest management; 5) disease management; and 6) economics and marketing. The first two modules are online, and OFRF is asking for farmer feedback to help develop the remaining modules.

Paint Product Stewardship to Begin in 2021

<u>New York Paint Stewardship Act</u> recently became the fifth product stewardship program established in NYS, after more than five years of persistent education and advocacy. In 2019, NYPSC worked in tandem with PSI, the American Coatings Association (ACA), and Citizens Campaign for the Environment (CCE) to lead a coalition of 43 local governments, municipal and industry associations, and other environmental groups urging the <u>passage of paint</u> <u>stewardship legislation</u>. The program, which will be managed by industry-run nonprofit <u>PaintCare</u>, is expected to launch in early 2021 and will offer hundreds of conveniently located drop-off locations throughout the state. New York is the 11th state (in addition to the District of Columbia) to adopt this program.

EPA Develops Food Stewardship Education Resources for the Faith Community

EPA's Food Stewardship education efforts aim to engage the faith community on protecting the environment through reducing food waste. Buffalo Food Waste Diversion is Available Year-Round

The City has tested and is launching year-round collection of food waste in an outdoor collection bin at Elmwood Avenue and Bidwell Parkway. Food scraps will be transported by Natural Upcycling to Buffalo River Compost. Since June 2019, over 1000 people have participated in the "Scrap it" program with six summer locations available for drop-off. Acceptable materials are fruits and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds and filters, egg shells, tea bags and nuts. For more info, visit <u>www.buffalorecycles.org</u>.

Solar-Powered Heritage Carousel

A solar-powered historic carousel had planned to open Summer 2020, but the pandemic delays have shifted the grand opening to spring 2021. The Buffalo Heritage Carousel, Inc. is nearing completion of the restoration of the 1924 Spillman carousel which features 34 hand carved and painted animals and 3 chariots. The Canalside building which will be its future home is currently under construction. Consider adopting one of the animals or contributing to the efforts of the project as they still need donations to meet their goals. Lead Pipes in your House? Get a Free Water Test

If you have determined your home has a lead service line, there are resources at your disposal. (If you missed our last alert on how to determine if you have a lead pipe, click here). Getting your water tested is an important next step to learn how much lead might be currently leaching from your pipes into your drinking water and the risks to your home. To receive a free lead testing kit through the mail, call (518) 402-7650 or <u>submit an online form to the NYS Department of Health</u>. Once you receive your test results, we recommend that you inform your local water department and learn what options are available to help replace lead pipes. Detection Dogs Project Underway

In a collaborative project to try to monitor spotted lanternfly (SLF) spreading across the region, detection dogs are being trained and tested. In a survey trial run in a vineyard and adjacent natural area, the two dogs went right to work to sniff out the SLF egg masses sometimes faster than their human partners could record. The SLF tend to lay their eggs in hidden places or on the undersides of objects, rather than in open areas and the dogs demonstrated that they can find them when they aren't easily observed by humans. Beekeeper Alert: Spotted Lanternfly can be Transported on Beekeeping Equipment

Spotted lanternfly (SLF) egg masses can be laid on hive boxes, lids, bottom boards, stands, pallets, etc. Beekeepers must check equipment, vehicles, and trailers for SLF prior to moving the equipment and transporting new colonies. If you find SLF individuals of any stage in your apiary or equipment, and you are not inside of the quarantine zone, it is very important that you report it here. In addition to the quarantine policies, lanternflies may impact bees in other ways. Part of the management and efforts to control the spread of this pest include the application of the systemic insecticide **dinotefuran** to trees infested with SLFs. These insecticide applications may directly or indirectly impact the health of honeybee colonies and other pollinators who may be directly collecting pollen and nectar from flowers of trees that have been sprayed with insecticides targeting SLF. Indirectly, honey bees may be using the honeydew—the sap that flows when planthoppers feed on plants—as a food source. Research groups at Penn State are investigating the direct and indirect effects of SLF control measures on bee health. The Center for Biological Diversity is partnering with the Girl Scouts of Western New York to offer two new patches that will allow girls to explore local wildlife, threats to biodiversity and actions they can take to protect the wild. Farming with Nature is the Solution

Check out a <u>video</u> for a vineyard that finds ways to support birds in its practices. Their actions support essential services for their vineyard like pest control from birds. Barn Owls are encouraged with nest boxes, and hawks with perches, keep Sharpshooter numbers down. About 80% of the land is conserved in vegetative habitat—native oak woodlands, grasslands, and chaparral—which provide other food sources for the birds to feed their young during nesting season, and to feed themselves other times of the year.

Help your Yard to Capture Carbon

American lawns account for about 2% of all the land area in the continental U.S.—and while that grass does absorb some carbon dioxide, it's not as much as other plants. Lawns also require a lot of upkeep and can end up having a bigger carbon footprint than what they sequester. A company is launching a Kickstarter for a new item that aims to remove some of the negative externalities of lawn care by making your yard absorb extra carbon, via the power of mycelium, the thread-like feeding structures of fungi. NetZero is making "yard bombs" which you dissolve when you water your lawn; the orb inoculates your yard with fungi known to capture atmospheric carbon. One inoculation lasts 10 years and allows the average-size American yard, which is about a quarter acre, to absorb a ton of atmospheric CO2 every year. If every lawn used a NetZero mycelium ball, founder Joseph Kelly says, we could go from 650 million tons of carbon captured by our yards every year to 1.3 gigatons. Read more here.

Citizen Science Project Lets You Fight Deforestation from your Couch

Looking for a hands-on way to contribute to conservation? SAS, a systems analysis company, teamed up with the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) to build an artificial intelligence model that can recognize signs of deforestation and they need citizen scientists to help them do so. In order to "train" the AI to recognize signs of deforestation in satellite images, the program is using dedicated volunteers to sort through images taken from space and look for clues. Citizen scientists who want to participate simply go to <u>the program website</u> and scan images for signs of human activity like cars, roads, or farm plots. This helps the AI learn where deforestation is being caused by human activity. Online Birding Tools: Learn more about our Feathered Friends

<u>BirdCast</u> offers real-time migration maps showing where birds are and in which direction they're going. Designed by scientists at the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, the site's forecasts are based on 23 years of radar observations combined with weather forecasts. <u>eBird</u> shares a citizen science project that claims to have more than 100 million bird sightings contributed each year by members around the world. You can use the site to track specific species or discover birds and hotspots near you. While you might need to wait until next year to use it, <u>Hummingbird Central</u> features an interactive migration map that includes first sighting data from citizen scientist contributors throughout the US and parts of Canada. In addition to maps, the site shares lots of hummingbird information about these fascinating fliers, such as the fact that a hummingbird's heart beats up to 1,260 times a minute.

En-ROADS is a transparent, freely-available policy simulation model that provides policymakers, educators, businesses, the media, and the public with the ability to explore, for themselves, the likely consequences of energy, economic growth, land use, and other policies and uncertainties, with the goal of improving their understanding. The simulation, developed by Climate Interactive, Ventana Systems, and MIT Sloan, runs on an ordinary laptop in a fraction of a second, is available online, offers an intuitive interface, has been carefully grounded in the best available science, and has been calibrated against a wide range of existing integrated assessment, climate and energy models. EPA Food Opportunities Map

Climate Watch: Biannual Community Science Bird Program

Grant and Scholarship Opportunities

National Priorities: Evaluation of Pollutants in Biosolids- The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is seeking applications proposing research that will provide the best available science needed to support states, municipalities, and utilities in determining potential risk from pollutants found in biosolids and developing standards and policies for biosolids management. Research under this RFA is intended to address multiple treatment scales including large publicly owned treatment works and medium- to small-scale wastewater treatment facilities. Deadline: January 5, 2021.

<u>Community Visioning for Vacant Land following Flood Buyouts in New York.</u> The objective of this award is to support a community visioning process for vacant land in New York communities where flood buyouts (i.e., managed retreat) from coasts or floodplains has occurred. The award is to foster relationships among decision-makers and citizens and provide a forum for a wide variety of community voices to create a shared vision for for repurposing the vacant land so that it can provide social and ecological benefits following retreat from flood-prone areas. <u>Organic Agriculture Research and Extension Initiative (OREI)</u> is a competitive grant program that focuses on integrated research, education, and extension projects to provide new tools and solutions for organic producers to grow and market organic agricultural products. Deadline: **January 14, 2021.**

<u>Young Farmer Grant Program</u>-The National Young Farmers Coalition's grant program helps young and beginning farmers and ranchers start up and grow their businesses. The program will provide 50 awards of \$5,000 - 45 grants will go to businesses already in operation, and five to projects starting in 2021. Deadline: **January 15.**

<u>Federated Garden Clubs of NYS Scholarship</u>- \$1000 The FGCNYS, INC. is offering \$1000 Scholarships to a full time student finishing his/her first or second year at a two or four year college. The student must be a legal resident of New York State but may attend college in NYS or elsewhere provided it is an accredited college and must be majoring in an area of study related to horticulture, planning, conservation and areas specified at the site. NFWF Five Star and Urban Waters Restoration Grant Program-The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) and the Wildlife Habitat Council (WHC), in cooperation with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), USDA Forest Service (USFS), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), FedEx, Southern Company and BNSF Railway are soliciting proposals for local water quality, water quality monitoring, and source water protection plans are specifically mentioned, among other activities and priorities relevant to source water protection. Deadline: January 28, 2021.

<u>Building Resilient Infrastructures and Communities Grant</u> - The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) makes federal funds available to states, local communities, tribes and territories (SLTTs) for pre-disaster mitigation activities. FEMA has published a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the BRIC grant program which should be reviewed before applying. Deadline: **January 29, 2021** @**3pmEST.**

DHS FEMA FY20 Flood Mitigation Assistance - \$200 million, Eligible Entities: tribal governments (federally recognized), state governments, local governments, and territories. The Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) program makes federal funds available to reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damage to buildings and structures insured under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). FEMA will distribute the available funding to specific types of projects listed at the site. Deadline: January 29.

<u>Rural Renewable Energy Projects</u> -To help producers save money and better utilize renewable energy, USDA's Rural Energy for America Program (REAP) will provide at least \$50 million in grants to support on-farm renewable energy projects for fiscal year 2021 (FY21). The program also supports the purchase of renewable energy systems and provides grants to help farmers with energy audits and renewable energy development. Deadline: January 31, 2021 (for energy audits) and March 31, 2021 (for renewable energy projects).

<u>Growing Spaces Urban Farming Grant</u>-Urban farming organizations, communities, and educational institutions are invited to apply to receive an in-kind donation from Growing Spaces, estimated to be approximately \$40,000. Considerations include impact and reach of the proposed project to an urban, low-income, and/or minority community, food desert status, organizational stability, and climate. Deadline: **January 31**.

<u>Grants to Support Water Systems Rural and Small Communities</u>- U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) funding will improve public health and environmental protection by helping to ensure that drinking water in these communities is safe and that wastewater is treated before it is responsibly returned to the environment. Eligible applicants are nonprofit organizations, nonprofit private universities and colleges, and public institutions of higher education. Deadline: **February 12, 2021**.

<u>Engineering Planning Grant (EPG)</u>- funding is available to municipalities through the Consolidated Funding Application for infrastructure projects that protect or improve water quality. A webinar to present the GIGP and EPG programs will be held on **January 13, 2021 at 11 a.m.** A recording of the webinar will be available on <u>EFC's</u> <u>website</u> after January 13. You may register for the webinar on <u>EFC's website</u>. Deadline: **February 12.**

<u>Green Innovation Grant Program</u>-The GIGP provides grants for projects that improve water quality and mitigate the effects of climate change through the implementation of green infrastructure, energy efficiency and/or water efficiency practices. A webinar to present the GIGP and EPG programs will be held on **January 13, 2021 at 11 a.m.** A recording of the webinar will be available on <u>EFC's website</u> after January 13. NOAA OAR Climate Program Office (CPO) Extreme Heat Risk Initiative Competition - \$500,000, Eligible Entities: state, local, tribal governments. Extreme heat in urban areas presents society with significant economic, health, safety, and security challenges. This competition supports a high-priority climate risk area focused on extreme heat, as well as are coastal inundation, marine ecosystems, and water resources. Deadline: February 15.

<u>Sustain Our Great Lakes 2021</u>- Eligible applicants include non-profit organizations, educational institutions, and state, tribal and local governments. On **January 13th, 2021 at 11am**, SOGL will host a webinar providing guidance for applicants, and answering your questions. To register. On **February 2nd, 2021 at 11am**, the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) will host a virtual workshop providing additional information about the SOGL funding opportunity, including specific guidance related to funding categories and an opportunity for one on one discussions. <u>Register</u>. <u>Eighth District Federated Garden Clubs of New York State Scholarship</u> announces a **\$1,000 stipend** will be awarded to a graduating high school senior planning to major in horticulture, agriculture, environmental science or related field and residing in a Western New York county. Deadline: Must be postmarked by **March 15**.

<u>Ryan Exline Memorial Scholarship</u>-Jamestown Audubon Community Nature Center education staff are joined by guests and together they raise money through a day long Birdathon. The \$500 scholarship raised through Birdathon is awarded to an area college-bound high school senior or college student who intends to pursue a Bachelor's degree in an environmental or related field. <u>Sustainable Agricultural Systems Request for Applications</u>-The Agriculture and Food Research Initiative's Sustainable Agricultural Systems grant program will fund projects that significantly improve the supply of affordable, safe, nutritious, and accessible agricultural products, while fostering economic development and rural prosperity in America. NIFA seeks applications that take a systems approach for projects focused on the themes in the USDA Science Blueprint. Deadline: **July 1, 2021.**

DOI FWS Coastal Program - \$13 million,Eligible Entities: county governments, Indian tribal governments, Indian tribal organizations, state governments, city or township governments, independent school districts, unrestricted The Coastal Program is a voluntary, community-based program that provides technical and financial assistance through cooperative agreements to coastal communities, conservation partners, and landowners to restore and protect fish and wildlife habitat on public and private lands. The Coastal Program staff coordinates with partners, stakeholders and other Service programs to identify geographic focus areas and develop habitat conservation goals and priorities within these focus areas. Geographic focus areas are where the Coastal Program directs resources to conserve habitat for Federal trust species. Deadline: **Sept. 30**.

<u>The Connect-Kids-to-Parks Field Trip Grant Program</u> (Connect Kids) is designed to connect students in New York State with nature and history. Each grant provides reimbursement of up to \$40 per student (and \$80 for Special Education students) for field trips to state and federal parks, forests, historic sites, fish hatcheries and other outdoor recreation areas. Deadline: **Rolling.**

<u>The Pollination Project Grants</u> support organizations/groups that do not have any paid staff with initial grants of up to \$1,000. Successful grantees become eligible for larger impact grants of up to \$5,000 and other support. One grant is awarded every day. Deadline: **Rolling**

<u>The Kars4Kids Small Grant Program</u> is dedicated to supporting education, mentoring, and youth development programs around the country that help children develop into productive members of their community. Grants typically range from \$500-\$2,000. Deadline: **Rolling.**

<u>Residential Curbside Recycling Cart Grant Program Request For Proposals</u>- to advance recycling in communities by offering financial and technical assistance to support the implementation of cartbased curbside recycling. Deadline: **Rolling.**

<u>H20 for Life Mini-Grants</u> provide \$250-\$500 mini-grants for schools to organize projects that educate youth about the global water crisis and help them take action to provide water, sanitation and hygiene education (WASH) for global partner schools. **Deadline: Rolling**

<u>The Karma for Cara Foundation</u> is encouraging kids 18 and under to apply for funds between \$250 and \$1,000 to complete service projects in their communities. **Deadline: Rolling.**

<u>NIEHS Conference Grants</u>-The mission of the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS) is to discover how the environment affects people in order to promote healthier lives. Conference grant applications have a direct relationship to advancing the mission of NIEHS. In order to be responsive, all conference grant proposals must focus on or clearly indicate relevance to advancing our understanding of the role of environment and/or gene-environment interactions in disease/dysfunction. **Deadline: Rolling.**

<u>Project Produce: Fruit and Veggie Grants for Schools</u>-designed to help increase kids' access to fresh fruits and vegetables and create experiential nutrition education when and where students make their food choices: in the cafeteria. The \$2,500 one-year grants support food costs to incorporate school-wide fruit and vegetable tastings into the school's nutrition program. Grants will be determined on an ongoing basis depending on available funding.

<u>Wells Fargo Clean Technology and Innovation Grant Program</u> funds projects and programs related to research and development for new and emerging clean technologies by working with universities, colleges, research institutes and laboratories as well as entrepreneur incubator, accelerator and business plan competitions. If you would like to submit a topic for consideration provide a brief description (150 words or less).

<u>Industrial Hemp Processing Grant Fund</u>-New York has also allocated up to \$5 million for grants for machinery and equipment required to process industrial hemp for commercialization. Grants may provide a minimum of \$50,000 and a maximum of \$500,000 for up to 50% of total project costs supporting capital investments. To be eligible, the facility must be located wholly in New York State which processes industrial hemp for commercialization.

<u>Toyota Every Day Capacity Building Grants</u>- Up to \$5000 for 25 Public Lands Friends' groups in each cycle. Projects that are needed and will help contribute to the long- term sustainability of the organization. Deadlines: **April 23 and other dates later in the year**.

<u>Food Waste Grants</u> - will provide reimbursement to businesses that generate over one ton of food waste per week to offset cost of select technologies and equipment that promise to reduce or divert that food waste from landfill or incineration. Eligible projects must reduce and/or divert wasted food at a New York State business including, but not limited to, supermarkets, restaurants, and hospitals. Monies will help food scrap generators implement food waste reduction recommendations, purchase capital equipment used in food donation, and create, improve, and expand diversion efforts to on and off-site compost and anaerobic digestion facilities. Deadline: **Rolling.**

<u>Cornell Douglas Foundation</u>- Its mission is to provide small grants to organizations which promote the vision of the foundation: advocating for environmental health and justice, encouraging stewardship of the environment, and furthering respect for sustainability of resources. **Deadline: Rolling.**

<u>Youth Pollinator Gardens Grant</u>- up to \$200, are available for projects that include educational materials on the vital role pollinators play in nature and youth involvement in planning and planting gardens providing nesting and food sources for pollinators. To apply for a grant, complete an NGC Grant Application, provide detailed information about the project, and submit your request to the NGC Youth Committee Chairman for approval.

<u>Saving Species</u>- We help local conservation groups purchase land for conservation and habitat restoration, and may consider projects for restoration of habitat on land that is within an existing protected area. **Deadline: Rolling.**

<u>VolunTEEN Nation International Service Project Grants-</u> Students (ages 13-22) from the US going abroad to volunteer or study in a developing country are encouraged to apply for an international service-learning mini-grant. Grants are for up to \$300 to create a service project in a developing country while you are visiting that country. **Deadline: Rolling.**

<u>KEEN Effect</u> is committed to inspiring responsible outdoor participation to help preserve the places we all play. Through the KEEN Effect, \$10,000 grants are awarded to nonprofit organizations around the world who are dedicated to responsible outdoor participation. Projects must increase responsible outdoor participation as a way to work towards building a strong community. **Deadline: Ongoing.**

<u>Everyday Young Hero Award</u>- young people, ages 5-25, who are improving their communities through service to others and making significant progress in achieving the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Each week, YSA selects one young person to receive this honor and receive \$250 grants to continue and expand their project. **Deadline: Rolling**

<u>The Fruit Tree Planting Foundation</u> is dedicated to planting fruitful trees and plants to alleviate world hunger, combat global warming, strengthen communities, and improve the surrounding air, soil, and water. FTPF programs strategically donate orchards where the harvest will best serve communities for generations. **Deadline: Rolling**.

<u>Cedar Tree Foundation</u>- Letters of Inquiry Accepted at Any Time. Areas: Environmental Education, Environmental Health, Sustainable Agriculture.

<u>Doris Duke Environment Program Grants</u>-For Nonprofits registered and working in the US. Permanent land protection (i.e., the acquisition of conservation easements or fee title interests to secure high-priority sites), management of lands already in protected status, and more. **Deadline: Rolling**.

<u>WalMart Community and Education Grants</u>. Rolling Deadline, but minimum 6 month lead time advised. 501 (c) (3) organizations, schools, religious organizations and government agencies for requests over \$250. For requests under \$250, get a local donation form from your nearest Walmart at the customer service desk.

<u>Environmental Research and Education Foundation</u>. Open. All educational materials for sustainable solid waste management, including conferences or events, which advance the foundation's educational mission. Grants are typically not provided to support the development of educational projects.

<u>Toshiba America Foundation</u>. Rolling deadline. Grades 6-12 Teachers. Under \$5,000. Inquiry based projects designed by teachers and teacher teams for use in the classroom. **Deadline for grants over \$5,000 is August 1**.

<u>KaBOOM! Let's Play Engineered Wood Fiber Surfacing Grants and Let's Play Maintenance Grants</u>- awards grants of \$750 each to communities who wish to top-off their Engineered Wood Fiber safety surfacing or who are working to make their existing playgrounds cleaner, safer and more inviting. **Rolling deadlines**.

<u>J-Serve Start-Up Grants</u>-J-Serve is the International Day of Jewish Youth Service. Grants are available for \$500 micro grant to communities that plan and execute projects that bring a minimum of 10 and maximum of 74 Jewish teens together in partnership with a least two movements or agencies in the community. **Rolling deadline**.

<u>Niagara Falls National Heritage Area</u> supports important projects and programs throughout the National Heritage Area with the long- term goal of realizing community betterment. Grants are targeted to fund projects or programs that directly relate to the <u>Niagara Falls National Heritage Area Management Plan</u>.

<u>World We Want Foundation</u> is accepting applications from organizations that represent youth making positive social change in their communities and around the world. Grants of up to \$5,000 will be awarded to youth between the ages of 13 and 25 who want to make a difference. Application deadline: **Rolling**.

<u>Shell Foundation Grant</u>—Programs that restore critical ecosystems, address water, air quality research, preserve wetlands and sponsor wetlands initiatives. Deadline: **Rolling**.

<u>Technical Assistance Grant Information</u>-The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) is continuously accepting applications for Technical Assistance Grants (TAGs). TAGs are a citizen participation tool available to eligible community groups to increase public awareness and understanding of remedial activities taking place in their community. Eligible community groups may apply to receive grants for up to \$50,000 per site.

<u>Home Depot Community Impact Grants-</u>Grants, up to \$5,000, are available to non-profit organizations and tax-exempt public service agencies in the U.S. that are using the power of volunteers to improve the physical health of their community. Grants are given in the form of The Home Depot gift cards for the purchase of tools, materials, or services.

<u>Fluor Foundation Grants</u>—Nonprofits and academic institutions. Projects promoting responsible stewardship of the environment and supports organizations that protect natural resources and habits through conservation, restoration and beautification, and environmental education. Birding Field Trip - DEC Winter Raptor Survey, Cayuga Overlook INWR, ***weather date is Sunday, January 24***. Tips for the Environment:

Reduce Waste and Recycle Right This Year!-Start 2021 off with waste reduction and recycling practices in mind! Learn the "ins and outs" of your local program so you can recycle right this year and reduce contamination in recycling streams across NY. Before you throw an item in the trash, take a second to search some alternative ways to use or manage it. Can it be reused? Can it be donated? Does your recycling program accept it?

Getting Takeout for home?-Opt out of disposable ware and condiment packets unless necessary.

Using a Meal Delivery System?-If it comes with gel-filled cold packs, consider what to do with them. Many are reusable, so share with others for their coolers or store a few for cold packs for injuries. Ideally, companies may offer a take-back program. You can also pass along these cold packs to nonprofits. Ask around at your local food bank, churches, schools, pre-schools, Meals on Wheels, and any other organization near you that prepares and moves food. If you decide to dispose of the gel in the bags, do not put the liquid down the drain, but dry it and put in the trash.

Recycling of PPE-The disposable masks and gloves that have helped keep us safe during the pandemic have been accumulating in trash. Terracycle does sell post-paid boxes for collection of materials that can be returned to them for recycling. Check them out <u>here</u>.
