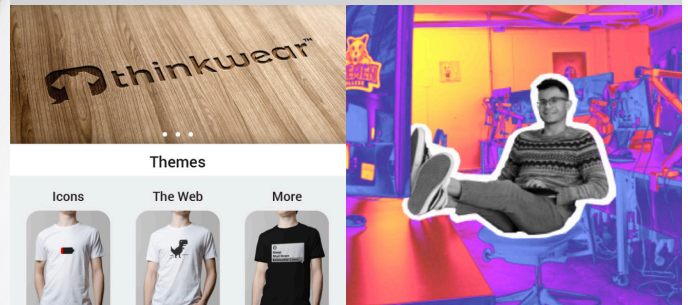

WHAT IS GRAPHIC DESIGN?

Graphic Design (visual communication), is the **practice of visual problem solving** through the organization of text, images, and content in a way that is meaningful, visually compelling, and serves to communicate an idea or topic.

The field of graphic design is broad, diverse, and ever-evolving. The faculty at Daemen College comes from a range of backgrounds, which enables various perspectives and skillsets that prepare students to enter the field as a design professional. The program features:

- **foundational skill building** through classes that focus on design foundations, and conceptual problem solving
